



## Nancy J. Moody

Vice President, Public Affairs, DTE Energy

Nancy J. Moody is vice president of Public Affairs for DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a Detroit-based diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide. Its operating units include an electric utility serving 2.2 million customers in Southeastern Michigan and a natural gas utility serving 1.3 million customers in Michigan. The DTE Energy portfolio includes non-utility energy businesses focused on power and industrial projects, natural gas pipelines, gathering and storage, and energy marketing and trading. As one of Michigan's leading corporate citizens, DTE Energy is a force for growth and prosperity in the 450 Michigan communities it serves in a variety of ways, including philanthropy, volunteerism and economic progress.

Moody is responsible for Force for Growth and Prosperity work with our company's community-facing activities, including philanthropy through the DTE Energy Foundation, volunteerism, education and employment initiatives, environmental leadership, policy leadership, community outreach, and economic progress.

Moody began her career with the company as a legislative representative for Detroit Edison. Three years later, she was promoted to director of the State Government Affairs office, responsible for advancing the company's interests on key public policy initiatives. She led electric industry efforts that culminated in comprehensive state energy policy laws enacted in both 2000 and 2008.

More recently, Moody served four years as director of Federal Government Affairs, where she managed DTE's Washington D.C. office. In addition to her leadership as the company's primary liaison with members of Congress and the President's Administration, she represented DTE Energy on several national industry associations' policy committees, including those at the Edison Electric Institute, American Gas Association, Nuclear Energy Institute, and the Interstate Natural Gas Association of America. Moody chaired the National Campaign for Home Energy Assistance and was the President of the Michigan Business Group in Washington, D.C.

Moody is a cum laude graduate of Kalamazoo College with a Bachelor of Arts. She spent two years studying at universities in Germany and France, and also taught French in a German high school.

Moody is an executive board member of Michigan Colleges Alliance and Michigan Communities in Schools. She has been honored twice as the Child Advocate of the Year by statewide non-profit children's advocacy organizations. Moody served six years as chair of the Michigan Children's Trust Fund Board, and served as an executive board member of the Mid-Michigan Advisory Council to Inforum. She also served as executive board director of Habitat for Humanity Michigan.
